

General Regulations FWO (Art. 2, § 2.)

- Following the Berlin Declaration of 2003 for the promotion of free access to scientific knowledge and cultural heritage, beneficiaries of FWO fellowships, grants and projects **must** deposit the publications resulting in whole or in part from the FWO subsidies, in a public **“Open Access” database**, in accordance with the provisions of Art. XI.196, §2/1 of the Code of Economic Law, within one year from the date of publication.
- Researchers are also advised to publish their other publications in such an "Open Access" database, the so-called "Open Archives", together with the research data that resulted in these publications.

Open access



What?

Open Access is the practice of making scholarly research results freely available online to the public, both within and outside academia, with the ultimate goal of maximising the impact of said research. Based on the principle that research financed with public funds should also be publicly available, the FWO requires that research results are published in Open Access ([FWO General Regulations, article 7, paragraph 2](#)).

Who?

The Open Access publication requirement applies to all FWO researchers, i.e. all holders of an FWO fellowship/project/grant who publish results achieved in whole or in part through funding by the FWO. In addition, the FWO aims to encourage these researchers to also publish their other works in Open Access.

How?

There are various ways in which researchers can publish their results in Open Access. The most conventional forms to be distinguished are as follows:

- Gold Open Access: When publishing in what is usually an online Open Access journal, whereby all publications are by definition publicly accessible;
- Green Open Access: When publishing in what is usually an online Open Access journal, whereby the author self-archives the article in an online database, often alongside publication in a conventional journal;

Upon applying for funding

List your five main publications.

Provide full bibliographic details of what you consider to be your (up to) five main publications.

List all authors, title of publication and journal name (without abbreviations) with volume, page and year. Mention impact factor of the journal (if applicable) and whether the publication was peer reviewed or not. For book publications, give all necessary bibliographic information (book title, publishers, editors (if applicable), etc.).

Do not forget to update ALL your scientific publications in your FWO E-portal "Personal details" section.

Use up to 2000 characters.

List any other scientific output and impact.

Please include any distinct research output that does not fit in the bibliographic publication list and that is meaningful in its scientific quality. It may be constituted by a data base, surveys, a technical diagram, software, objects (maquettes, prototypes ...), keynote lectures, exhibitions etc. Describe any scientific or other impact beyond publications and obtained research funding.

Use up to 2000 characters.

Attention for publications...

- “List your five main publications.
- For book publications, give all necessary bibliographic information (book title, publishers, editors (if applicable), etc.).
- Do not forget to update ALL your scientific publications in your FWO E-portal "Personal details" section.”

... but also for other output

- List any other scientific output and impact.
- Describe any scientific or other impact beyond publications and obtained research funding.
